- > Pray that our church elders will have wisdom as they lead our local churches.


- > Pray for the continuing work of Hands & Feet, and for God's protection over that ministry.

'A letter to explain the Gospel'

In recent years Don Stormer has written a number of useful Bible study books covering letters the Apostle Paul wrote to various new churches he had planted or been involved with.

Don's latest book 'A Letter to Explain the Gospel' (released last month) deals with Paul's letter to the church in Rome, one which he had not visited.

It is a very comprehensive book of 26 chapters (over 260 pages) and yet it is very helpful, dealing with each verse of each chapter of Paul's longest letter in our Bible. It is all about Paul's great treatise on the gospel in which he explains every aspect of the gospel – from the sin of man (which excludes man from the presence of God, unless he is forgiven) through to the way a believer should live. The gospel is meant to change us so that we live sanctified lives. published by Christian Outreach Book Service

This book does not claim to be an academic study of Paul's letter. Rather it has been written for the believer to gain an understanding of what the Scripture teaches. It has also been written for translation into the language of Armenia, a country where believers have a lack of commentaries in their own language.

To help the reader, at the end of each main chapter there is a helpful summary, plus a short "To us today" section, followed by a set of "Study/ discussion questions" which will be useful if the book is used by either an individual or by a Bible study group.

Don Stormer has been engaged in a teaching ministry for many years. After teaching in various secondary schools in New Zealand and Fiji, he and his wife, Helen, moved to Sydney in the late 1980s. There he was Academic Dean of Emmaus Bible College in Sydney, and then Principal of the College for a number of years.

Since then Don has been involved in an itinerant ministry in different local churches and has had opportunity to teach by interpretation in South Korea, Romania, Moldova and Armenia. Some of his books have been translated into Armenian and Romanian.

My wife, Bee, has been a tremendous help in the circumstances in which I find myself. She is learning to drive a car and this will be a great help when she gets her Licence.

Please pray for us both. We can no longer go to Nowra Assembly because of the driving situation, so we attend a local Christian fellowship.

Some of you will have known Claude Fox, my first wife's brother. Claude died *last month and has left behind his wife Cath. Please pray for her, she was a great help to Claude during his illness.*

We were saddened that **Robert Wright**, Joanne's father, **passed away** on the 27th August 2019. We would have mentioned it in the last newsletter, but we had already printed it and the letters were in envelopes, ready to post. He is

I felt God say "you should pray for this person" and I said "nope"... and that voice kept saying "you should pray".

There were other staff around and I felt awkward, so I said to God "if everyone leaves the room and it's just us two, I will". Just then a student came in and asked for all the other teachers by name and I was left with this other staff member! So with a bit of shock and frustration I went over to the her and asked if I could pray for her. To my surprise she said "YES, I was hoping you would ask me that". So I prayed and asked God for healing of her arm and to show Himself to her. When I said amen, I had a meeting I had to go to and was also unsure of the outcome. She stopped crying and said "How did you do that"? I said "Do what?" "How did you bring back the feeling in my arm"? I replied "I didn't. That's all God and He loves you and wanted you to know that."

Praise God for this wonderful moment in her life. Please pray that this will open more opportunities to tell this person, and others, of how good God is.

What follows is an overview of Andrew's message – drawn from his outline notes, but first a word of caution! Nothing can match being in the presence of a good speaker who is well prepared and knows "his stuff" with a passion! So, what follows is 'second-best'.

Read Luke 10:17 to 20. This contains two keys to developing a Thanksgiving Lifestyle.

#1. A Thanks**giving** Lifestyle starts by thanking God for transient blessings we come across in everyday life [God Sightings].

#2. A Thanksliving Lifestyle is cultivated by thanking God for the intransient blessings that only come from eternal life [God Blessings].

Read also 1 Thessalonians 5:18.

Practice: God Sightings. On any given day, there's always something to praise Him for and there's always something to trust Him for. Look out for signs of His goodness and greatness.

Look out for God in your Quiet Time. Look out for answers to your prayers. Look out for God's general grace.

Look out for His Divine providence.

Look out for 'God Sightings' in the words and actions of fellow believers, like an encouraging text message. **Proceed:** However, Jesus is doing more than encouraging His disciples to develop a Thanksgiving Lifestyle by thanking God for transient blessings, he wants His disciples to cultivate a Thanksliving lifestyle by thanking God for His intransient blessings that only come from eternal life [God Blessings].

Re-read John 10:20. The greatest source of joy has nothing to do with earthly events. It comes from knowing your name is written in God's heavenly book, and that you are assured a place in His eternal kingdom!

Practice: God's Blessings. So, as a Christian, here are five intransient blessings you can be thankful for:

#1 The salvation that has been given to you (Ephesians 2:8,9).

#2 The plans that are developed for you (Ephesians 2:10; Jeremiah 29:11).

#3 The transformation taking place within you (2 Corinthians 5:17).

#4 The future guaranteed and waiting for you (John 14: 1 to 4).

#5 The promises that are true about you. (Joshua 23:14; 2 Corinthians 1:20).

Read also the promises in Psalm 92:12-15 and particularly verse 14 "They will bear fruit in old age, they will stay fresh and green".

Don't be a Whinger, be a Thanker!



University Chaplaincy Report for NSW

This report was first submitted to the recent Coordinating Conference meeting in Burwood and distributed as an attachment to the Minutes of that meeting.

The University of Sydney

Geoff Folland continues to serve as the CCCAust Chaplain at the University of Sydney while also leading the Power to Change campus ministry team. There are over 60,000 students that come from right across Sydney, all around Australia and from around the world. Like the neck of an hourglass, they spend three to five years in this sprawling campus community before leaving to places right across Sydney, all around Australia and around the world. The strategic nature of campus ministry has never been more apparent.

Geoff represents CCCAust to the university and the university to local CCCAust churches. As a parachurch (i.e. chaplaincy) mission leader, Geoff sees that his ministry must connect with local church culture, parachurch culture and campus non-Christian culture. Christian students arriving from local churches should feel supported in their ongoing involvement in their local church. Power to Change does not replace the role of the local church, but supports them in mission on campus. And non-Christians who respond to the gospel must be established in a local church through their involvement with the group on campus.

McCrindle Research

An exciting initiative was undertaken in a partnership between Geoff, as CCCAust Chaplain, and Rowan Kemp, the Anglican chaplain. They, on behalf of their respective organisations (Power to Change and the Evangelical

Union) commissioned McCrindle Research (at a cost of \$14,000) to survey students involved in faith groups on campus. While the report has not been publicly released yet (and it will be made available when it has been), Geoff can report that, with over 500 students surveyed, there were some interesting results. Over 90% of students involved in a faith group on campus know a chaplain and 92% report their experience of their chaplain is extremely or very positive. Almost all students who are highly involved in their faith group on campus also say they are highly involved in their local church. And when they experience stressful or difficult times on campus 72% identify their faith group on campus as the place to go for support, equal with family. The most concerning statistic was that only 56% of students involved in faith groups feel safe practicing and talking about their faith on campus. This is an alarmingly low percentage considering these students are receiving support from a faith group. It must be even lower for Christians who are trying to go it alone!

The result of this research is to demonstrate the strategic value of chaplains to the campus experience for a large proportion of the student population. Geoff is looking forward to engaging with the university administration to see this value recognised by the university in a variety of ways.

2019 Activities

In addition to the regular, daily demands of campus ministry at both the University of Sydney and the University of Notre Dame – which involves personal discipleship, leading small groups, preaching, coaching student leaders, and training new missionaries, Geoff has continued to speak and write as the opportunity arises.

Geoff preached 8 times in June, and 8 times again in August. Many of these talks are now available on his YouTube channel: search for "Geoff Folland" (https://youtu.be/FGGuNkLqPPU). He also recorded a limited series of video podcasts dealing with issues for new believers called "Start Up Faith" (https://youtu.be/4KtQHm20idw). He published 3 e-booklets of popular talks (www.amazon.com.au, search for "Geoff Folland") with the titles:

➤ Steps of Faith: What Peter's Walk on the Water Teaches Us about Faith Today.

> The Church in Transition: The Most Significant Transition in Church History and What it Means for Today.

➤ The Dew of Hermon: Christian Unity: What it is and How it works.

Geoff also ran a SHIFTm2M training group for pastors and ministry leaders that met once per month to read the gospels and study the life and ministry of Jesus. He travelled to Melbourne to meet with other SHIFTm2M leaders, including Andy Hodgson (CCCAVAT) who is running their emerging leaders training. And he continues to serve on the board for Ambassadors for Christ International (AFCI) Australia, supporting Aaron Daniels (RTCC) and John Fleming (Wollongbar) as they provide Evangelism*SHIFT* training to various churches around Australia.

2019 Finances

Since being commended 25 years ago, in 1995, to serve as the chaplain at Macquarie University, Geoff has continued to trust God to supply all he needs. He has seen God's faithful provision through the generous support of a couple of churches and many individuals. And 2020 will provide more opportunities to trust God with finances – especially for upcoming overseas travel.

2020 Plans

While most activities will continue to roll forward there are a couple of unique opportunities.

First, Geoff has been invited to spend a week with the Global Executive Team of Cru Global in Orlando, Florida in December as they engage in global strategic planning for the next 5 to 10 years.

Second, Geoff is arranging to take students from Sydney to Fiji in July for a special 2020 combined Mid-Year Conference, joining students from Perth, across the Pacific Islands and New Zealand. The conference will be cheaper, but he is raising funds to help subsidise the flights.



Inspiring Hope Camps

This summer, *Inspiring Hope* is running 3 camps for kids in foster care – creating opportunities for them to spend time in a positive environment, be encouraged and inspired to overcome the challenges in their lives, and most importantly create a space for them to learn about God.

In the last year we have seen a number of kids who have come through our camps go on to become leaders. It is such a blessing and privilege to watch these leaders share with other kids from similar circumstances, about the difference that knowing God has made in their lives. The faith that they have come to understand through these camps, they are now passing on to other campers, in the beautiful process of evangelism and discipleship intertwined.

This is a testimony from one of our leaders:-

"My most impactful moment of camp was seeing campers raise their hands to accept Jesus and knowing that when they go home, God goes with them." (Brad – a leader at a Made to Make a Difference (M2MAD) camp in 2018.)

We love creating opportunities for people to be on the front line of God's



mission and have the opportunity to see first hand the power of the Gospel to transform lives. We are passionate about not only seeing the campers come to know God, but also about seeing leaders grow in their understanding of who God is and the calling that He has placed on their lives.

A short history of the Bible in Oz



Boorong was the first known Indigenous Australian to have substantial exposure to the Bible. She was sick with smallpox in 1789 when Governor Philip's men took her to Sydney for treatment. Rev Johnson and his family looked after her for 18 months. Boorong saw the clergyman's family reading and studying the Bible, and heard him preach from the 'buk' on Sundays^[1].

Boorong, like other Aboriginals in that era, encountered the Bible as colonisers tried to educate and 'civilise' their communities. Christian missionaries brought the King James Bible into their society, together with other products of European civilisation. Indigenous Australians learned the Bible as they learned English^[2].

The Bible Society started in Australia in 1817, making the Bible available to the public^[3]. For non-English readers, they brought in Bibles in Welsh, Hindi, Scottish Gaelic, Russian, Chinese and other languages^[4]. They desperately also wanted to get the Bible into indigenous languages.

Lancelot Threlkeld, together with Aboriginal translator Biraban, finished translating Luke's Gospel into the Awabakal language in 1831^[5]. This could be Australia's first Indigenous Bible translation^[6].



The list of Indigenous languages grew slowly in the 1930s and 1940s.^[7] In 1942, when Wycliffe Bible Translators began in the USA, CMS missionary Len Harris and his best students, Grace Yamambu and Bidigainj, translated Bible passages into the Wubuy language of Arnhem Land^[8]. Madi, who heard it read at a campfire, was excited to realise that 'Jesus speaks Wubuy'^[9].

Wycliffe Australia started in 1954, with some of the first translators sent to work in languages overseas in places like the Philippines and PNG. Others formed AuSIL (Australian Society for Indigenous Languages)* and worked in the languages of Bandalang, Burarra, Kuku Yalanji and Wik Mungkan.^[10]

Translation efforts picked up in the 1960s and 1970s. The most significant result of this was the Kriol Bible, the first full Indigenous Australian Bible. This **Holi Baibul** was published in 2007, after about 30 years of work by people from Wycliffe, AuSIL, the Bible Society, and the CMS.^[11]

REFLECTIONS

It is a special time in the office when the mail is opened and we receive the courses back from the students and many of them tell us of their spiritual journey towards God. He has blessed the work and the students and it is a real joy to be involved in this process of getting the Word to Australian students.

The past quarter has been excessively busy, not with the usual office processing of courses in and out but with preparations for the Annual General Meeting. We also needed to order the calendars and distribute the ones freighted to Sydney to the various prisons and churches.

Unfortunately we had a substantial deficiency of around \$9,000 – causing us to need to call on reserves to see the year through.

We have had to replenish our stock of courses from the USA and Canada and this was somewhat more time consuming than in the past. We received one bag from the US in error and two of our boxes of courses never turned up! They still haven't, but have been replaced by the US. This problem caused us to run out of a couple of titles and also hindered the markers in their choices.

The GradeCam system is bedding down now and performing so it is now becoming seamless. It does help simplify the markers' work.

CALENDARS

Ordering and distribution of all calendars for 2020 is now complete. Orders this year were down slightly from assemblies and churches but prison numbers continue to grow. There were 22,900 calendars going to inmates and 10,419 to churches. This will lead to a shortfall of some \$10,000. We are trusting for this deficiency to be funded by gifts from the Lord's people who recognise what the ECS courses and the study of the Bible do for many inmates. Not a week goes by but we read of someone making a decision to follow Jesus. Please pray that the cost deficiency can be met because our \$-reserves will only allow the free work to inmates to continue for a couple more years.

We do not want to stop sending calendars to prisons but we may be forced to for those where we do not have any students. This could mean that an opportunity for a new student, and thus a born-again believer, is lost.

Our thanks go out to the many volunteers who helped to unpack and deliver the calendars to prisons and churches. Our deliveries go out west as far as Dubbo, north to Cessnock, and south to Cooma and Junee. Of course the most are delivered in Sydney with Long Bay, Silverwater and Parklea prisons receiving large numbers.

POSTAGE AND FREIGHT

We have just received notice from Australia Post that our postage costs will be rising between 6% and 10% from 1st January. If we take the lower fugure it will add around \$30 a month to our costs. Freight costs seem to rise continually and the cost for courses from the USA is substantial but we are very pleased that ECS International discount these expenses.

COURSES

The decision to use two short courses as introductory courses has proven very successful. We have permission to print them in Australia and this is being done in Toowoomba with substantial cost saving. It has also had a big impact on postage cost as it is smaller and fits into a letter size envelope. Although some hundreds of requests are received for free courses after the inmates receive their calendar, unfortunately a high percentage are not returned for marking.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank all those involved in the work this year and to wish all our readers a very Happy Christmas and may you know the blessing of the Lord in 2020.



"A word from the Director:

Welcome to the home of *truthXchange*, where we seek to turn spirituality "inside out." What do we mean? We live in a very "spiritual" world, but it is important to know which spirituality you adopt. The Apostle Paul says, and this comes as a shock to many, that there are only two spiritualities:

1. worshiping and serving something "inside" creation (what I call "Oneism"), where all reality is the same and thus one, or,

2. worshiping and serving the God who stands "outside" creation ("Twoism").

Reality is made up of two kinds of being: the Creator, a majestic personal being with no beginning, who is different from us; and creation, of which we are a part. We have a beginning and are limited by space and time.

Mission statement:

truthXchange equips and empowers churches to communicate the gospel effectively and lovingly to a culture that has lost the crucial distinction between worshiping creation and worshiping the Triune Creator and Redeemer.
