

News from the February Coordinating Conference

Representatives from many of the NSW Assemblies met together again at the Coordinating Conference on Thursday, 4th February, at Emmaus Bible College. It is good to see God's working amongst the Assemblies and the para-assembly activities.

Upcoming Conferences were discussed:-

VITAL – Youth Conference: The 2009 Conference was a great success and another will be run in November 2010.

Men's Conference at Camp Toukley: "Humility – The Attitude of Christ" is the theme of this year's conference. Bill Newman and Sean Nolan will bring the teaching on Friday evening, > 7th and Saturday, 8th May. Registration Forms are now available.

Ms Jacqui Maynard is the speaker at this year's Women's Conference (21st and 22nd August, at Camp Toukley) looking at "Purity in Practice - Studies in Titus". The organisers are planning to have a Mediterranean theme for the conference based on the fact that the letter to Titus is set in Crete.

The National Conference at Mueller College in QLD on 12th to 14th June is looking at "Life at the Crossroads – Being a Bible based, Culturally Aware, Involved Christian". The speakers are George Verwer, Founder of Operation Mobilisation, Dr Mark Strom, Principal New Zealand Bible College, and Jeremy McQuoid, author and pastor.

The International Brethren Conference on Mission, which runs every 4 years, is planned for France in 2011. The theme is "I will build my Church". More details are being included on the CCCAust web site (www.cccaust.com) for those interested.

Reports were given by Dom Valastro, the new CEO of Lutanda, and Sonny Ng, an Elder at Faith Community Church (FCC), Blacktown. Dom spoke of the need for Lutanda to consolidate and build a secure financial future. The team at Lutanda are working hard to define a positive future for the organisation. With about 20,000 people going through the 3 camp sites each year and with 8 children in the homes, the organisation can have a significant impact on people's lives. The Assemblies have a great opportunity to support this work by:-

1. Using the sites for our own assembly camps;

2. Sending our kids and contacts to children's camps so they can hear the good news of Christ;

3. Encouraging our young people to attend camps as leaders. This is a great atmosphere to develop young leaders.

Sonny spoke of the growth of FCC over 10 years and the fact that the church is multicultural – made up of many nationalities. Over that period the church has started two ethnic churches, a Korean church at Burwood and a Filipino Church in Blacktown. Present outreaches are having significant impact in the Indian and African cultures. The assembly is using GLO interns and working in local schools to form relationships with the community. AWANA is a children's club they run that is having significant effect in the Indian Community.

Emmaus Bible College is now offering a Bachelor of Theology course and has brought in some extra lecturers. The college now has 8 lecturers and is running 7 subjects as well as Certificate III & IV Courses. Dr Joe Thomas (Ph.D. M.W.S. M.Div. B.Sc.) is the latest addition to the teaching team. Dr. Thomas has been teaching theology, religious studies, and ethics for the last eleven years in Ohio, USA. As a professor of theology, he has participated in several >8



ecclesiastical and academic projects both in North America and the Asia-Pacific region. Dr. Thomas has served four years as an educational missionary in Nigeria. He has developed and taught a number of courses in the graduate and postgraduate programs in theology and mission. Dr. Thomas' works are published in academic journals on a regular basis. His current research is in public theology.

The NSW **Home Workers Treasurers** are encouraging Assemblies to be generous as the number of supported workers increases. This is an exciting time as God is touching people's lives and more people are taking up the challenge to serve God in full and part time positions. This month we had the privilege of recognising the commendation of Roy and Maru Gomez to Youth Work at St George Community Church. They will be supported by the Home Workers Fund.

As we recognise God's work in various areas we were also sad to acknowledge the closing down of Toowoon Bay Gospel Chapel and Allowera Community Church.

We continue to get enquiries from independent churches asking if they could join the **CCCAust network** of churches. The committee has had an approach from Yamba Christian Home Church and will try and meet with them and then report to the Coordinating Conference.

Outreach

Wilson Masih reported on the planned **Evangelism Crusade** he is leading, with 6 other people, into Pakistan and India later this month. Pray for this team as they spread the good news of Jesus.

In other news, the Coordinating Conference is having ongoing discussions on how best to help the country Assemblies. In gathering the 'prayer and fasting' prayer points a number of country Assemblies have asked if there was a support network to help an Assembly grow in its community. Some ideas coming to the fore include, 'adopt an Assembly' or 'partnering with a country Assembly' whereby a Sydney or larger Regional Assembly would take an active interest in a country Assembly and provide resources, where possible, through speakers, holiday Bible Club, or other means, to help encourage growth in the country areas. Web-casting monthly services over the internet has also been suggested and as the technology is developed it would be possible to web-cast some live teaching to Country Assemblies thus helping them with their teaching needs. As Emmaus is developing this technology for on-line lectures, they have suggested that we may be able to use these resource to also help our country Assemblies.



Christmas Day 2009 at Port Botany

As you probably know, seafarers are separated from their families for 8 or 9 months every year, sometimes longer. On Christmas Day it is especially hard for them to be away from their wives, children and other family members. Because of this, Greta and I, together with some of our Christian brothers and sisters, visit seafarers onboard some of the ships that are in Port Botany on Christmas morning. We do this to demonstrate Christian love and to show the seafarers they are not forgotten. Each seafarer we visit receives a gift-wrapped shoe box containing Christmas presents. It is also an opportunity for us to place Bibles and Scripture portions into the hands of seafarers who might not otherwise receive them.

On Christmas Day 2009 we visited a ship called **mv Empress Phoenix** and another called **mv MSC Nederland**. Previously, on Christmas Eve, I visited the captains of both ships to

ask permission to visit the ships on Christmas morning. I explained that, if possible, we would like the crew to come together for about 30 minutes so that we could sing a few carols for them, read the Bible and then distribute gifts. Both captains agreed.



Empress Phoenix has an all-Chinese crew of 27 men. When all the crew were gathered together we sang two carols and then I asked the third officer to read out aloud to the crew the account of Jesus' birth from the gospel of Luke. In the photograph above you can see him reading from the Chinese >>

Bible I provided. The man standing on his right is the ship's captain.

After the Bible reading we sang 'Amazing Grace' and we gave each man a shoe box containing various gifts. In the other two photographs you can see the men opening their presents.



MSC Nederland has an all-Russian crew of 24 men. Again, when all the crew were gathered together, we sang two carols. After this I asked the Chief Officer to read the account of the angel's announcement to the shepherds of the birth of a 'Saviour who is Christ the Lord,' as recorded



in Luke 2. The Chief Officer did this using a Russian Bible I provided.

Then, as on the first ship, we sang 'Amazing Grace' and gave each man a shoe box of gifts.

In the photographs taken onboard this ship you can see me interacting with the Ship's Captain (above) and also the Russian seafarers (below) opening their gifts.



Along with various gifts, each shoe box contained a Bible Gems Calendar and a small book, written in Easy English, entitled 'The Meaning of Christmas and Easter.' This book provides a condensed overview of the message of the Bible with particular emphasis on the fact that Jesus Christ >20



is 'the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world.'

Onboard both ships we were also able to provide some of the crew members with Bibles in their own language – Mandarin for those onboard Empress Phoenix and Russian for those onboard MSC Nederland. Copies of the booklet, 'Ultimate Questions' - in Mandarin and Russian – were also made available to crew members. This booklet provides a comprehensive and extended explanation of the gospel in a visually attractive format.

On Christmas afternoon, I felt I should visit a chemical tanker called **mv Pro Jade**. The crew onboard consists of 11 Koreans and 9 Filipinos. As a result of some hard work on Greta's part, I was able to take a small gift for each crew member onboard this ship. I also distributed calendars and copies of the booklet, 'The Meaning of Christmas and Easter.'

Whilst onboard, the Korean Captain invited me into his office and introduced me to his wife. It was then I discovered that the Captain and his wife are both born again. I sensed that the Captain was thankful for my visit and for the opportunity to fellowship with another brother in Christ on this special day, albeit very briefly.

Later, when I inquired of the Captain if there was anyway I could help him, he asked if I could provide some Bibles for placement in the ship's library. One hour later, after collecting the Bibles from home, I returned to the ship and had the joy of giving the Captain the English Bibles he had requested, together with some Tagalog and Cebuano Bibles for use by the Filipino members of his crew.

Ôverall it was a busy day! Nonetheless, we were thankful for the opportunity to make the Word of God and Scripture portions available to men from four different countries, working onboard three different ships.

A testimony to God's Grace

"You did not choose Me, but I chose you and appointed you so that you might go and bear fruit – fruit that will last – and so that whatever you ask in My name the Father will give you." (John 15:16)

Dear brothers & sisters,

I would like to praise the Lord for giving me this opportunity to share my testimony with you. From an unbeliever to a Christian, it is a challenge and huge change for me and my whole family. Both my husband and I feel so blessed to be Christians because God shows His great mercy to us and goes through all the difficulties with us.

Back in 2003, I was having my university study in Guilin, China. One day my professor asked me whether I could teach an American family some Chinese. I was so cheerful because the pay was good and I could practice my English as well. The only thing that worried me was I wasn't quite sure what Chinese material to be used. Before asking the American couple on what material I want to use, this couple said: "don't worry; we have our own Chinese material for you to teach."

I looked at all these handouts, without knowing what they were. Then I started my Chinese teaching a few days later. I still remember the first sentence I taught. It was: *"For God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life."* (John 3:16)

I had no idea of what was that about at that time. I spent some lovely time



with the three kids and their parents. They went back to the United States later on. I started to work after I graduated from the university and came to Australia in 2007. I nearly forgot this Chinese teaching experience until August 2007.

I was studying in Macquarie University with Lisa who later introduced me to Eastwood Christian Fellowship, which used to be called Eastwood Gospel Chapel. I joined the Friday English and Bible study group which was organised by Lillian Fleming and Hilton Dupen. I knew little about religion though my grandmother was a Muslim, so Christianity was completely new to me. "Let's make some friends in the church and practice my English there", I thought. The first time I opened the Bible the first sentence I read was>24



from John 3:16, "God so loved the world..."

It reminded me of my Chinese teaching in 2003. I suddenly realized that God was trying to deliver a certain message to me a few years ago even when I didn't know Him. Praise the Lord! It says in the scripture (Rev 3:20), "Here I am! I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in and eat with them, and they with me."

I am sure my professor and the American family have been praying for me earnestly. I have been learning God's words and was baptized in

March 2008. I called my professor, telling him I became a Christian and I was so thankful that God sent His message to

me through him. He said, "Praise the Lord! I am very proud of you!"

Later on I married my husband Jovi, who also became a Christian a few months after our marriage. Before Jovi became a Christian, he wasn't very impressed about the Bible and the church because, in his opinion, God only represents spiritual things. He wasn't a powerful God. But all the brothers and sisters in our church have been praying for him. One day, as we both believe on that day, God gave Jovi a chance to see His great power and put his trust in Him. We got a notice from the landlord telling us to move out in two months. It was extremely hard for us to find a place to move in at that time. We tried many

times and we couldn't find any place. I didn't have a job as a new graduate. We needed some financial support from our parents to take another unit so Jovi's father sent some money from China to him. Unexpectedly, our money had been transferred to another account due to the bank's problem and we had to wait for weeks until this problem was sort out. We had no place to live then. We worried so much and didn't know what to do. Jovi was very upset. I tried to comfort him and asked him to pray to the Lord. He started to pray, "God I don't even know whether you exist or not. I am still wondering

but I would like to put my trust in you this time. Please show us your great mercy and help us to go through

all this difficulties." Amazingly, the next day we got a call from the bank, telling us the money was back to our account. Our new home was settled and I found a job on the same day. We believe they were given by God. Jovi became a Christian and started to learn God's word after that.

The way of following the Lord is not always laughter. It's a path of thorns and roses. But the most important thing I have learned through the tough stories is to put all our trust in the Lord.

In 2009, my mum's younger sister was found to have cancer. She had her first operation in May but the tumours had spread to her kidney in September very quickly. I couldn't believe it was >

to live

true. She was so healthy when I left home. I grew up with my auntie and she was just like my mother. I couldn't accept the fact. I kept crying from day to night, hopelessly. I told the elders in our church about my auntie's suffering and my affliction. The whole church was praying for me and my family. I thought I should do something for auntie because I hope God will look after her even though she wouldn't stay in this world. Auntie was not a Christian, how can I tell her about God? I decided to send a song to her. I chose "Amazing Grace" and sent it to my brother so that he could play it to her and I explained the basic knowledge about God the trinity and the heaven to mum. I prayed that God can open auntie's heart through my mother. Mum promised me she would deliver the message to auntie. While mum was telling auntie all about God, I knelt down before God, praying that He would take auntie's sufferings and burdens away.

The next day, mum told me the whole story. "Amazing Grace" was played and the whole family accompanied her and prayed for her. Auntie cried when she heard "Amazing Grace". She put her hands on her heart gratefully, saying praise the Lord. Every one in the room heard the message and cried. The next day she passed away. But I know she is with God in peace. I believe that God had opened auntie's eyes and He will look after her for us because our Lord Jesus says in the scripture, "... blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed". (John 20:29)

We are chosen by God and become His children not by chance. He sent Jesus to die for our sins and yet we have eternal life through His death. Also, I have a peaceful and blessed life as a Christian. I pray to our dear heavenly Father to send more people to us, so we can deliver His message to them through us. Please use us, Lord! We would like to serve you and glorify you. Brothers and sisters, please pray for us to reach more young people and help them to know more about the Lord. Pray for us to be mature in God's kingdom and that wisdom will be granted to those who teach the scriptures. Thank you.

Parklea Markets Outreach



Do Hard Things (for God)

A teenage rebellion against Low Expectations

This book 'Do Hard Things' was first published by Random House Inc in April 2008 and was written by Americans Alex and Brett Harris. Now they have a another book soon to be released called "Start Here".

The publisher declared "Written when they were 18 years old, "Do Hard Things" is the Harris twins' revolutionary message in its purest and most compelling form, giving readers a tangible glimpse of what is possible for teens who actively resist cultural lies that limit their potential."

One reviewer wrote "This book is a battle cry for young people all around the world to step up to the plate and do hard things. It's written in a conversational style, complete with witty analogies and real-life examples to keep your attention. The book that adults didn't know teenagers wanted, will inspire your young adult to strive for better things and make a difference in their world. I bought it, read it, and haven't stopped recommending and loaning it to people. Every parent, teen, pre-teen, pastor, and youth pastor needs a copy!"

Another wrote "This is one of the best 'motivational' books I've ever read, that encourages teens to rebel against the low expectations of our culture! Whether you're a teen, a parent, teen worker, or just anyone who encounters teens at all - read this book! You will not regret it."

The book was written several years after the twins launched their Internet

blog in August, 2005 and then the www.therebelution.com website a year later (which has received over 14 million hits). Just three weeks after the blog was launched, it was featured in a column in the New York Daily News, the sixth-largest U.S. daily newspaper. "Think big! HS Twins Tell Peers" read the headline. The column opened with the words, "Most high schoolers' blogs are the online equivalent of perfumed diaries or locker room walls-outlets for teens to gossip, confess, and network with their pals. But a pair of 16-year-old home-schooled twins from Oregon are out to change that."

Their father, Gregg Harris, a pioneer of the Christian home-schooling movement, knows something about how to raise "real-life rebelutionaries."

A few weeks ago he spoke to hundreds of people in Anaheim at the first of 10 "Raising Kids to Do Hard Things" conferences. At the seminar, Harris offered the simple approach he and his wife have taken in raising Alex and Brett Harris.

Their parenting strategy – based on Psalm 112: 1-4 – teaches parents to create a home environment that encourages youth to "do hard things for the glory of God and for the good of others" and to become "mighty in the land." "If your parents delight in God's commandments, you may become mighty in the land because you will get the benefit of walking with the wise and they will make you wise at an earlier age," Harris told hundreds >28



of parents and teens gathered at the Marriott Anaheim. "By being wise at an earlier age, you won't waste so much of your time, and rather than running away from challenges, you'll begin to do hard things because they are good, right and are virtues."

Tragically, we live at a time where people seem to expect very little of teenagers. If our teenagers manage to avoid dangerous drugs, manage to avoid pregnancy and manage to avoid completely derailing their lives, we consider these years a success. We maintain low expectations and are not surprised when teenagers deliver very little.

'Do Hard Things' is a book for teens-but a distinctly different kind of book for teens. In your local bookstore you'll find many cheap, throwaway books for teens, because young people today aren't supposed to care about books, or to see any reason to keep them around.

But this book is a challenging book, and one written by teens for teens. It's message is simple but far too often overlooked in society today: **rebel against low expectations**. The authors reveal a vision of a better way of doing the teen years, rather than how so many teens have been "conditioned to believe what is false, to stop when things feel hard, and to miss out on God's incredible purpose for [the] teen years."

They look at 5 kinds of hard things that can challenge the expectations of those around them: things that are outside of your comfort zone; things that are beyond what is expected or required; things that are too big to accomplish alone; things that don't earn an immediate pay off; and things that challenge the cultural norm. They describe each of these through stories and examples drawn primarily from their lives and from the lives of other "rebelutionaries" who have shared their stories with the authors.

Another reviewer wrote "there is something inspiring in watching teens shake off the low expectations that plague them and there's something in it that makes me want to examine where I may also have fallen prey to low expectations." Writing as the proud older brother of these authors, Joshua Harris says truly that "Every former teen needs this book, too. I know I do. There's no age-limit on the Rebelution. It's never too late to do hard things."

In this book Alex and Brett Harris rebel against low expectations and encourage their peers to meet the challenge of doing tough things for God's sake and for God's glory.

Readers have expressed the wish that they had read this book when in their teens, and pleasure that their children will have the opportunity.

I pray it will stir them and stir a whole generation of young people, to use their teen years to do the hard things God calls them to do. And I pray that the teen years are only the beginning, only the foundation, of lives fully lived to the glory of God.

Internet Evangelism Day (IED) is nearly upon us again – April 25th is worldwide web focus day for churches. I wonder if anyone in the NSW Assemblies has used it as a focus for web evangelism in previous years?

"The last 15 years have changed our world for ever," claims Tony Whittaker, co-ordinator of Internet Evangelism Day. "Digital media are transforming the way we communicate, behave and even think. If Facebook was a country, it would have the fourth largest population in the world."

Internet Evangelism Day is a strategic resource to help the worldwide church understand these issues and use the Web to share the good news. It is both a year-round online guide and an annual focus day.

Churches are encouraged to use Internet Evangelism Day resources to create a presentation for their members on or near that Sunday (or at any other time they choose). The IE Day site offers

free downloads: PowerPoint, video clips, handouts, drama scripts, music and posters. These enable any church (or homegroup, college, or conference) to build a customized program, lasting from five minutes to fifty.

2010's focus day will be the sixth to be used by churches around the world since the initiative's launch in 2005. Over this period, digital media have developed dramatically – with the advent of YouTube, Facebook and Twitter, and the growing use of mobile phones to access online services. The outreach opportunities have multiplied too.

IE Day's website is also a one-stop resource covering many subjects, including – how to build a church website that is 'outsider friendly', using Twitter in evangelism, and blogging. Perhaps surprisingly, you do not need to be technical to share your faith online. And you can volunteer to be an email mentor to inquirers with several large online outreach ministries.

IED is an initiative of the *Internet Evangelism Coalition*, based at the Billy Graham Center, Wheaton. It is supported by a wide range of leaders and groups. "I am glad to commend Internet Evangelism Day," says John Stott.
