It was hard for us to leave all our friends at Campbelltown Christian Community Church and our family in NSW but with the Lord confirming in our hearts this move, we finally made the decision to go.

The first few months were a big learning curve with new roles, a new place, a new Church and many challenges but also many opportunities.

Our 17 students come from Australia, Singapore, Malaysia, South Korea, PNG, and USA. What variety, especially as we learn to appreciate each other's differences. We can say we love them all, what a great bunch.

Highlights for us would be leading a short term mission trip to the Philippines

Irene and other ladies from our Church have Scripture classes in local Schools, it is an ongoing pressure that these classes ➤

*continue in our State schools, I know from experience that it is the only Gospel message that some will ever hear.*

*Continue to pray that it will continue, and that the seed sown will stay.*

*A few weeks ago we had two local power failures then power surges, by the time I purchased a UPS the damages had been done with the first power failure, it took out the Motherboard and other gear.*

*So a total computer rebuild, I lost some software and 80 Gig of files.*

*Christian Media Services Inc. urgently need ongoing monthly contributions for our broadcast fees to keep us on air, even regular small donations would be a great help.*

*Pray for the work, workers and for our Outreach and need of funding.*

# “In Everything Give Thanks”

1 Thessalonians 5:18 in the King James Version reads, “In every thing give thanks: for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus concerning you”. For many of us, this has been a familiar verse since our childhoods. But what does it really mean to give thanks in everything? What about when our circumstances are difficult, even hostile? How can we be thankful for situations that are not as we would like them to be?

“In Everything Give Thanks” was the theme of this year’s NSW Women’s Mission Convention held at Oatley Gospel Chapel on Saturday, 10 September. It was attended by around 100 women from 18 different churches and featured five different missionary speakers who shared with us how they

have learned to be thankful in diverse circumstances.

The afternoon began with a keynote address from Janice Collins who reminded us that Thessalonians was written by Paul, a short term missionary, to the Thessalonians, a church which was faithful to Christ in a hostile pagan environment. She also pointed out that Paul himself suffered greatly for the gospel (2 Corinthians 11:24-26).

Yet, “in everything give thanks” does not only apply to missionaries and suffering Christians. For all of us, intentional gratitude can be the antidote to fear and hostility, producing in us hope, joy and peace through the Holy Spirit. Psalm 46 reminds us that “God is ➤

our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble” and to “Be still, and know that I am God”. This is why we can give thanks in everything.

Our first missionary speaker was Sharon Thomson, who together with her husband John, works in computers and care-giving for Bible translation with Wycliffe Bible Translators in the United States. Sharon shared with us her very personal journey of learning thankfulness through caring for her mother over the past five years. By keeping a regular Thankfulness Journal, Sharon has learned that thankfulness lifts the heaviness and there is always something to be thankful for, no matter how small.

Ros Baird has been working with her husband Steve in Mindanao in the Philippines since 1997. Most recently, Ros has been based in Brisbane while her daughter, Kaitlyn, completes her education and Steve travels back and forth to the Philippines to support the small struggling church there. They are thankful for the ease of international travel and communication in this day and age, but also for doors opening for new outreach in nearby villages, the opportunity for local Christians to teach Scripture in local schools and work teams from Australia who have come to support them.

The next speaker, Cherie Snellgrove, also works in the Philippines with her husband Dave, but in an urban setting in Manila. They have founded Safe Haven, a community centre and children’s home, which provides temporary homes for neglected, abandoned and

abused children. Cherie testified to how good God is, even though it has not always been smooth and easy. She is thankful that God called them to the Philippines with a sense of urgency, to be the hands and feet of Jesus and to provide a loving Christian family atmosphere for these children where there is always food, laughter, love and hugs.

We then heard from Luba who has recently returned to Australia with her family after spending 8 years teaching English to postgraduate students in a university where her contract did not allow her to speak about religion or politics. Although her integrity was tested and stretched at times, Luba shared her thankfulness for God’s answers to prayer in the development of a discipleship ministry among the young people of that city. As Hudson Taylor said, “When we work, we work. When we pray, God works”.

Finally, Janice shared with us again how thankful she and her husband Andrew have been to be part of what God is doing in Cambodia over the past two years. Janice had been back in Australia only 10 days and shared a little of her journey, both outward and inward, as she and Andrew have been involved in mobilising and equipping Christian youth to walk alongside those who walk alone. She reminded us again from Psalm 146:7-10 of God’s heart for the marginalised and ended the day with the final words of that Psalm, a fitting end in keeping with our theme of thankfulness – “Praise the Lord”.



# Book Review of 'Preparation for Ministry'

Every once in a while one comes across a little gem of a book that is short and to the point, but very helpful precisely for those reasons. This is what the reader will find when he reads *Preparation for Ministry* by Allan Harman, who describes himself in the introduction as a student, pastor, and seminary teacher. This author knows from personal experience what it is like to wrestle with a variety of questions that surround the call to ministry, preparation for ministry, and ongoing usefulness in ministry. The book is composed of 7 short chapters, and contains 4 appendices which take up as much space as the rest of the book and account for its overall length of slightly more than 100 pages.

What I really like about the book is its intentional brevity. This makes it ideal for someone who is pondering some basic questions around whether God is calling them into the Christian ministry. If a more detailed treatment of this subject is required other books will be needed but this book gives the reader a concise summary that can be consulted time and time again when it comes to some of the things that should be taken into consideration when it comes to ministerial training.

Chapter One is about coming to faith in Christ. This may sound like an unnecessary place to start but that is not the case. It is essential that those who aspire to the pastoral office truly know the Lord. Great harm has been done, and is still being done, by those who have never experienced the

regenerating power of the Holy Spirit and do not know what it means to bow to the authority of Jesus.

Chapter Two takes up the call to the ministry and answers questions like how does God call people into ministry, how does a person assess a sense of their own calling, how do they test God's call on their lives objectively, and what role does the judgment and advice of others play in this process. The author has also said some helpful things about the role of families and the thoughts and feelings of spouses in the process of discerning the Lord's will. In my experience, I have found that all of these factors must be considered by those who are seeking to know God's direction in their lives.

Chapter Three is about pre-theological study. It reminds the reader that before any formal studies are begun there are things that can be done by way of preparation. Harman talks about taking heed to our spiritual growth as Christians, paying attention to the variety and quality of our reading, starting to gather resources for a personal library, taking time to listen to top-notch sermons both past ➤

and present, and about counting the financial cost of training. Again, these are common sense kinds of things, but alas, as someone has said: "common sense is very uncommon"!

Chapter Four is about choosing a theological college or seminary. As a seminary principal and professor I am glad to see this chapter in the book because we live in a day when some are of the opinion that seminary training is unnecessary for those going into the ministry. In my opinion, this is a big mistake. Although there are notable examples of excellent men who did not have formal seminary training, they are the exception and not the rule. In our day we need people who know their Bibles well and who can communicate the vast array of biblical truth to others in a way that challenges the idolatry of the surrounding culture. Thus, studying at the right seminary is very important and that means taking due-diligence when it comes to the faculty and staff of the school, as well as its doctrinal position, to name but a few things that need to be taken into consideration.

Chapter Five is about the actual course or courses of theological study. Sometimes students arrive at seminary with the misconception that the work will not be as rigorous as in other disciplines. Nothing could be further from the truth. The study of God's word is very challenging and in some ways the most challenging thing a person can study. Harman reminds us that along with the demands of theological learning there are also

many blessings. Our relationship with God, and His church, and our fellow students should be enhanced as we come to grips with the impact of the truth on our lives.

Chapter Six is about one's early days of ministry and it is full of helpful and practical suggestions. Here we are exhorted to remember the privilege of ministry, the need to keep learning, to plan, to be patient and flexible, to deal with differences of opinion and controversy, among other things. Again, this is the voice of pastoral experience speaking. He knows what he is talking about because he has been there and he has learned these lessons amid the ups and downs, and the joys and sorrows of ministry.

Chapter Seven is about staying fresh as time goes on. As important as seminary is, it cannot begin to give you all you will need to know for a God-honouring and vital ministry. Ministers must continue to study and learn. They must read, and attend conferences, and make sure that their own spiritual lives are nourished. They must also take breaks and vacations. No one can keep on going week after week without taking the time to refresh and recharge their spiritual, emotional, and physical batteries. It is also important that ministers focus on the church they have and not the one they would like to have in the future, or the one that exists only in their imaginations. The grass is not greener on the other side of the fence, and it is essential that we give ourselves wholeheartedly to the work at hand.

The book concludes with four appendices that enhance this work as a helpful guide to preparation for ministry. The first appendix is a suggested reading list. It is limited in its scope but it certainly represents a good place to start with readings in areas like biblical content and theological study, church history, theology, preaching, the Christian life, philosophy and apologetics, and evangelism. The second appendix is a very short but helpful guide, or perhaps outline, to sermon preparation. Larger books on the topic will cover all of the points mentioned in more detail but this appendix is a good checklist that will help the preacher remember the different aspects of the sermon preparation process. The last two appendixes are reprints of two classic addresses by C.H. Spurgeon and B.B. Warfield respectively. Although both were spoken to college and seminary students years ago they eloquently speak of matters that will never cease to be issues until the Lord returns for His people. Everyone contemplating ministry as well as those who are already engaged in it would do well to read and re-read these classics and take to heart what these giants of the past have to say.

*Preparation for Ministry* is a book that should be read by those contemplating ministry, those who are graduating from Bible college or seminary, and those who need to reflect on what God has done in their lives, what He is presently doing, and what He will

do in the future as they are faithful to Him. It would make an excellent gift for inquiring as well as graduating students as they seek the Lord's will for their lives and they listen for the voice that not only wakes the dead but calls the living to serve Him.

**In short, this book is highly recommended!**



# Back from Eastern Europe

I recently returned home after six weeks in Eastern Europe. In one sense the visit is now a memory, but in many ways I find that I am very attached to that part of the mission field and even though the time will come when I can no longer visit, the believers there have a special place in my thoughts and prayers. There is always a keen desire to listen to the exposition of the Scriptures and this is extremely encouraging.

I spent a week in Moldova with Christian Mission International Aid (CMIAid) teaching from Paul's letters to the Ephesian and Philippian churches. This was followed by two weeks in Romania, the first with a Baptist church in Bacau teaching from 1 Corinthians, and the second visiting assemblies in the north-east. Then I went to Armenia and joined the team from Armenian



Christian Mission (ACM). The second week in Armenia was spent teaching Galatians at a Bible College.

In Armenia, the work of the two organisations I am most closely linked to – Child Evangelism Fellowship (CEF) and ACM – continues to be blessed by the Lord. A number of younger teenagers were saved at this year's CEF camps. There were three week-long camps in the summer, one for children and two for junior ➤

teenagers, in which a number of young people came to faith in our Lord Jesus. Encouraging stories have emerged of teenagers whose lives are changed as a result of the Spirit working in their lives during the camps. After the camps vacation Bible schools were held and these also saw much blessing. One couple organised and conducted four of these schools, reaching more than 300 children. Many of those children and young people came to the Lord in faith.

The encouraging part of this work is the effort made by the CEF staff to build up these young believers in their faith, holding weekly meetings to encourage them as young believers. This is important as many of these children and teenagers come from nominal Christian backgrounds and receive no spiritual help at home. Please pray for this continuing work.

There were other encouragements too. In recent years some of my commentaries on New Testament letters have been translated into Armenian and these have been well received. One

brother asked for permission to record them for people who learn better from listening rather than reading. Another brother who has connections with Persian people wants to translate my books into their language.

Though Armenia calls itself a Christian country (it boasts it was the first country in Europe to become Christian) the number of evangelical Christians is small, and few of them are wealthy. CEF and ACM have over 15 full-time workers in the field, all hard working and going far beyond the call of duty. But they are not well supported. If there are people reading this who are interested in supporting these workers (or perhaps supporting and praying for one particular person or couple) I would be happy to supply them with information and arrange for them to receive the worker's regular newsletters.

# Book Review – ‘Small Church, Big Impact’

This book, written by Brandon O'Brien, editor-at-large for *Leadership Journal*, finds a way of celebrating some of the advantages of a 'strategically small' church without being critical of larger churches.

He was involved in small-church ministry as a student pastor. Instead of using this simply as a stepping stone for later ministry in larger churches he began to appreciate the virtues of the small church.

O'Brien has included plenty of stories about 'small' churches and by way of definition writes that:

"I've called these churches strategically small not because they are small on purpose (for the most part) but because they recognise that being a small congregation has its benefits. More to the point, they are putting those benefits, that hidden potential, to good use. These churches recognise that running a small church as if it were a big one undermines the smaller congregation's key strengths. In a culture, even a Christian culture, that values size, celebrity, and institutional visibility, these strategically small churches are under-reported and under-appreciated."

The author mentions the hunger in contemporary culture for authenticity and believes that smaller churches are well positioned to cultivate intimate relationships among their congregation. Whilst smaller churches find it hard to compete in the *excellence* game, *authenticity* has levelled the playing field.

Responding to need is another feature that the author considers is an advantage

as it doesn't require being mediated through special programs and can often have participation from a significant proportion of the church body.

He values the unique position small churches have to provide a base for mentoring and discipleship using the concept of 'ministry midwives': the encouragement into ministry of people within the church who have a combination of gifting, passion, and calling. The benefit of a greater lay involvement in ministry is examined as a way of helping more people find a way to serve the Lord.

O'Brien places *mission* at the heart of the small church activity, recognizing that mission is "not a means of growing a church; mission is the church's purpose and goal."

He champions the cause of the inter-generational church, although he recognises that at times this is hard to achieve because of a lack of people. Smaller churches don't have the same pressure to segment their ministry into age specific groups. He covers the biblical basis for an experience of a worshipping community that is one, with the concept of family now extended beyond our own immediate kin.

This book is not a long read, and for those involved in small church ministry it serves as an encouragement and further food for thought.

For those ministering in larger churches the book is helpful especially for those seeking to maintain intimacy, authenticity and lay involvement. □

## Syncretism

Time for a small quiz. Look at the following statement and ask yourself if it is biblical:-

“Love means being tolerant, accepting and non-judgemental.”

Would it surprise you to learn that... it's not! You may be inclined to think there is an element of biblical truth in that statement and therefore the whole statement is valid. But that's not the case. It's actually a mixing of non-biblical ideas with biblical truth. This is called “syncretism”.

Because it is very pervasive, it's important to examine syncretism's causes and how we can battle it in our own lives and when we share the gospel.
